To be eligible for election to Junior Warden a Brother must be able to open and close the Lodge on at least one degree as Acting Master. According to the Arizona Masonic Code (AMC), he must also be able to give the obligation on one degree. In many Lodges and in ours, the Junior Warden along with the Stewards are responsible for seeing that refreshments and meals are served at meetings. This doesn't necessarily mean that they do it themselves. They could use candidates and Entered Apprentices to assist. They also see that the Lodge is set up and prepared for degrees and meetings. Once again, this is a good function to have the assistance of Entered Apprentices. To them it can be a learning experience for future responsibilities and a deeper knowledge of Masonry.

Hopefully, those Brothers who wish to become Junior Warden will have learned a Major Lecture and have given a charge and minor lecture. They should know the by-laws of the Lodge and have a working knowledge of the AMC. During their time as Junior Warden, they should attend the Grand Lodge Leadership Academy and the Grand Lodge Annual Communication where they represent the Lodge with a vote on all Legislative matters at Grand Lodge.

The Junior Warden is to see that the Brethren conduct themselves with judicious temperance in social situations. It is also the responsibility to do the initial investigation of Masonic charges and to make a recommendation to the Master as to the disposition of those charges whether that be to proceed to a Masonic Trial or other lesser dispositions.

The Junior Warden is well placed in the progressive line of the Lodge to become its Master in due time.
