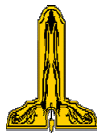
...from the East

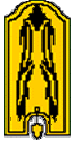

The oldest existing written record of our Craft is a document known as the Halliwell Manuscript, or Regius Poem, written by a unknown author about 1390. Although written nearly six centuries ago, it shows Freemasonry to have been very old, even at that remote date.

Thank you to those of you who have stepped up and paid your dues for 2013. It is greatly appreciated. However, there are still a few of you who need to pay your dues.

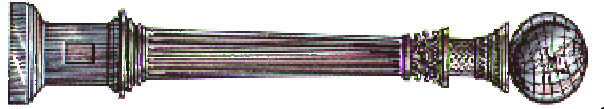
