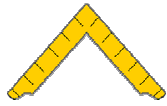


....from the East



Brethren,

The Brethren of Apache Lodge have passed several changes to our Bylaws in recent months that in my opinion make our Lodge more inclusive and open to Good Men from all walks of life. You have reduced the Lodge dues to \$50.00 per annum plus Grand Lodge per capita due this December 31 for next year; with a \$10.00 automatic increase each ensuing year for 5 years. You have also made a provision for dues to those 75 years of age and older, and who have been members of Apache Lodge **IN GOOD STANDING** for 5 consecutive years to \$12.00 per annum plus Grand Lodge per capita.

The Brethren have also recognized the value of being initiated into out Ancient and Honorable Fraternity by raising the Initiative Fees to \$225.00 plus Grand Lodge fees.

To complete this portion of our Bylaws - all that remains is to consider changing the Dues for affiliated members. That is, those Master Masons who wish to join Apache Lodge, but also keep their Home Lodge Membership in another Lodge. I hope you attend the next Stated Meeting to discuss this issue.

Saturday, November 1st, is our Annual Open House for the Public to be held in conjunction with Camelback Daylight and Oriental Lodges.

Voting for next year's elected Officers will take place at the November Stated Meeting - please take an active part by attending that meeting.

We need our team of members to demonstrate a thorough knowledge of their responsibilities and of their ritual - to take part in the work of the various committees - and to support the Brotherhood by your regular and enthusiastic attendance. There are no small jobs in Apache Lodge. Everyone has a vital part to play. It is only through your support and team work that we can make an impact for good in our community. Many have stepped up for which we are thankful - many more are needed. In these troubled times - fear not - **you, ARE a Freemason!**

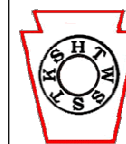

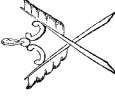
